The book for 4th grade is <u>Charlie and the Chocolate Factory</u> by Roald Dahl. While there are so many great books to read over the summer, <u>Charlie & the Chocolate Factory</u> was chosen because of its ease of reading and interesting characters. Students can read with a parent or by themselves and complete the novel study.

This novel study is designed to have students read three chapters then answer comprehension questions. It also contains several brief writing exercises that ask students to think critically for themselves, tell about themselves personally, or express thoughts they may have. **Students should answer all questions in complete sentences.** Question responses may vary in length - there may be two sentences, three sentences, or a paragraph needed to answer each question. If students need more room, please write on a separate piece of paper. The novel study is due in the first week of school.
